In the classroom, students partnered across grades to research countries from around the world, creating beautiful posters and presentations to share their discoveries. Lower Division News:

The past couple of weeks have been a wonderful adventure in learning and creativity in K/1! In Maths, our class has dived into data collection and analysis, using tally charts and bar graphs. The students were incredibly engaged, especially when they created their own survey questions. They took on the exciting challenge of collecting data from across the school, and our favourite surveys asked students to predict how many ducklings would hatch and to vote on potential names for the new ducklings. The surveys not only taught students valuable skills

in collecting, presenting, and analysing data, but they also connected us with the entire school community.

In Writing, we've started exploring persuasive texts. During Week 4, we used *The Day the Crayons Quit* as inspiration. The students each chose a crayon and wrote a persuasive piece explaining why that colour was their favourite. This activity brought out a lot of creative ideas as they spoke passionately on behalf of their chosen crayon! In Week 5, we continued our persuasive journey with *I Wanna Iguana*, where the students wrote persuasive letters either arguing for a pet iguana or for a pet of their choice. It's been wonderful to learn about each student's dream pet and hear their imaginative reasons why they should have one.

Our key learning area this term has been focused on life cycles, and we just wrapped up our duck hatching project! After 28 days of

anticipation, our class celebrated the arrival of our adorable Indian Runner ducklings. This was a huge highlight as we learned not only about life cycles but also about responsibility and care.

We even designed little duck coops from recycled materials, and our feathered friends tested each one to find their favourite!

Another special moment was their first swim—an event the entire school joined to watch and cheer for.

Even Gina had the help from one of our ducklings for the morning.

Finally, our 12 little ducklings will be ready for new homes at the end of the year. Middle Division and Upper Division:

Murringo Public School's Time Capsule Opening and Reburial

Our time capsule that was buried 25 years ago will be dug up and opened on Friday, 13th December at a special morning tea hosted by our school students at 9.30am. It will be very interesting to see what our community buried in the time capsule, so many years ago. Our currents students will be each preparing something to put into the time capsule ready for it to be reburied to be opened in another 25 years time. If your family would like to add something for the time capsule, please do not hesitate to either drop into Gina or bring it along on the day. Hope to see you all there. A coffee cart will be onsite to order your special coffees and tea, all supplied for by the school and P&C.

You are invited to the grand opening of our Time Capsule which was sunk on the 4th Dec 1999 to mark the closing of the 20th Century.





The Murringo Community secured some of the village's memorabilia in a time capsule to be opened in December 2024. Len Dowling officiated at the ceremony, which was organised by the P&C President, Lisa Hennock and School Principal, Mark Thomson at the time.

Families and residents from Murringo placed memorabilia and items of interest into the time capsule which was sealed and buried under the shade trees on the school grounds. Every pupil contributed an article about themselves, detailing their ambitions and their lives to date, complete with a photograph. Mr Dowling interred a copy of his family history and other residents placed photographs, shopping register slips and items of interest. The capsule will be reburied for another 25 years and reopened in December 2049.
