Lower Division News

Lower Division were pleased to have Mr Archer back in the classroom this week to get their creative spirits rising. They played some singing games, listened and responded to musical patterns and made a start on some creating some lovely owl artworks. We have completed our science topic about changing and combining materials and will finish off with a huge bang (literally), as we make our way to Wagga Wagga theatre to watch the Alphabet of Awesome Science performance. We've had many other educational activities to fill the week including handwriting, typing club, reading groups, free writing, sentence booklets, friends of ten memory games, friends of twenty puzzles, addition topics in our maths textbook, news groups, fitness classes, volleyball, YSS dance practice and discovering yes vs no feelings in our health lesson.

A reminder that homework has commenced and requires students to complete a Reading Eggs online lesson 4 times a week. Miss Whitechurch is checking weekly completion and can track who is completing the online tasks! Detailed instructions were sent home with login details. **If you do not have access to technology or need support using devices at home, please contact the school** and we will do all we can to support your child's homework completion. *Students who evidently complete all elements of their homework are rewarded with a blue card.*

Middle Division News

This week Middle Division students explored the informative text of procedure; it was equal parts fun and frustrating for our students to learn how specific and explicit we must be with our instructions if we want someone to be able to complete a task exactly right. It was a great introduction to 'rewriting for meaning'. Middle Division students had to return to their drafts 3, 4 and more times to ensure that their instructions were going to work. It also led into a fantastic conversation about assumption and why we can always think that everyone knows everything we know.

In maths we have moved on to addition and subtraction, starting with partitioning Middle Division students are extending their knowledge of known patterns. For example, if 3+7=10, then 30+70=100 and 300+700=100, as well as the inverse 100-70=30. When students know and can manipulate these facts mentally it makes addition and subtraction a snap. We are also continuing to work on our students place value knowledge, extending into thousands and even tens of thousands in some very tricky circumstances.

Middle Division student have also started their first product design for the term, they are required to design something to 'keep them dry in the rain.' They have completed their sketches and equipment lists and are up to construction and redesign next week. Miss Jackson is looking forward to seeing whose design will be able to stand up to our bush shower which will be our rain for testing.







Upper Division News

Another action-packed week in Upper Division with another debating opportunity, a visit from our Year 3 friends on Friday while the rest of Middle Division were on their excursion, Mr Archer was back to teach us all creative pursuits and we heard some excellent recorder pieces emanating from the COLA on Tuesday after lunch.

Aside from that we used our time to explore the "s" sound in spelling. It can be made with many different letter combinations. For example, 's' as in seal, 'ss' as in class, 'se' as in house, 'c' as in city, 'ce' as in juice and 'x' as in explain.

In History, we discussed what 'country' means to people. We thought of many words such as home, safe, connected, proud, welcome among others.

In Science, we learnt many facts about the sun, through a song and wrote about things we had knew already and what we had learnt from the song.

Miss Whitechurch has been visiting us, as part of her DCO role, and working on many different computer applications. Typing club has become a firm favourite and within the Microsoft Suite of programs we have been discovering the many aspects of Sway, which is a version of PowerPoint that has been given many more features.

In maths, we have been working on division and discovering how it relates to multiplication. Lots of students find division difficult, but we have been slowly working through the strategies and achieving some good results.
